9D: Summary, Implications, and Applications

1. Summary of Lessons 9a-c

- a. We asked if Jesus predicted His death, if His enemies claimed He predicted His death, and if others claimed He rose from the dead.
- b. We considered the biblical ABCs of the resurrection, the seven minimal facts of the resurrection, and the four examples of evidence for the empty tomb.
- c. We discussed the RISEN acrostic and the 6 Es of the resurrection.
